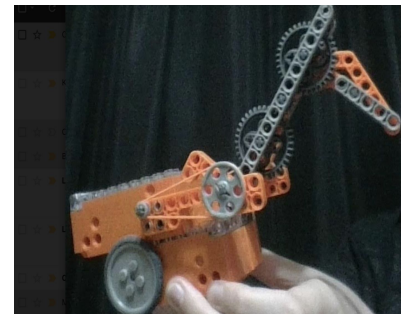

Rugby: 🏉 weather permitting our first game will be on Wednesday 16 September - 12:30 pm at Levin School (Levin Intermediate School field).

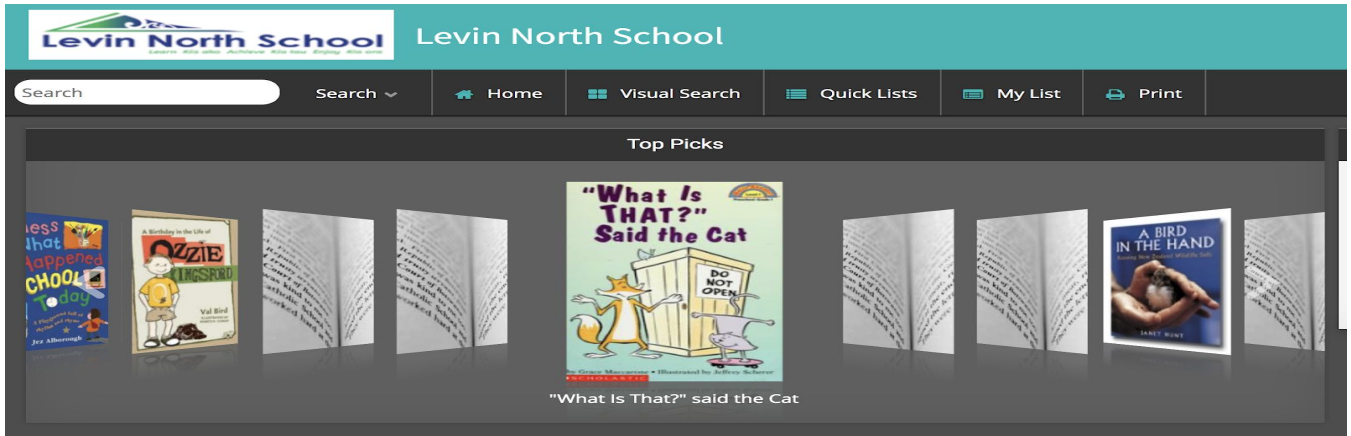
